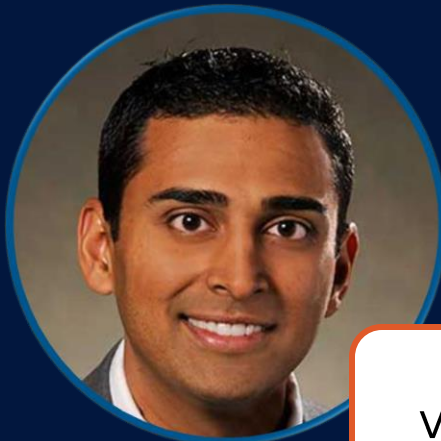

Description: Due to improving technology, cardiac CT is now a viable alternative to nuclear stress testing and/or invasive angiography in the workup of patients with both acute and stable chest pain. It offers anatomical assessment of the coronary arteries and can identify subclinical disease which helps guide risk factor modification. We will discuss the current level of evidence, patient selection, pitfalls, and interpretation.
