**Description:** The learner will be updated on advances in treatment options for hip and knee arthritis. This will include a detailed discussion on nonoperative measures that are currently in use. This will also include a detailed discussion on operative treatment options. Unique to the discussion on operative treatment options will be updates on surgical technique, same day discharge, and technology in total joint arthroplasty.
