

Please Join us for Medicine Grand Rounds: My Patient Struggles with CPAP - Now What?



Description:

This Grand Rounds session is designed for physicians involved in the diagnosis and management of obstructive sleep apnea who encounter patients struggling with CPAP adherence. Led by two ENT surgeons specializing in sleep surgery. The presenters will review contemporary surgical options, including hypoglossal nerve stimulator implantation and pharyngoplasty techniques, highlighting patient selection, workup (including drug-induced sleep endoscopy), and real-world outcomes. In addition, the session will explore evolving non-CPAP therapies, with focus on the growing role of weight loss strategies and GLP-1 receptor agonists in improving OSA severity and surgical candidacy.
